# 2024 PRESIDENTS REPORT

Dear ITFNZ Members and Supporters,

It is my pleasure to present the 2024 President's Report for International Taekwon- Do. This year has brought significant change within our organisation, yet we have continued to uphold our high standards of teaching and events. Throughout the year, we have remained committed to the values of Taekwon-Do, fostering excellence in training, competition, and personal development at all levels of our membership.

## **Senior Dan Grading – 27th January, Wellington**

Our year began with a Senior Dan Grading in Wellington, marking the culmination of a six-month intensive training period for nine members grading for ranks ranging from 4th to 6th Dan Black Belt. I congratulate all candidates on successfully demonstrating their technical proficiency, commitment, and deep understanding of Taekwon-Do, earning their promotions to senior ranks.

## **RISE 2024 Women's Conference – 5th to 7th April, Auckland**

The RISE 2024 Women's Conference brought together 20 participants for a weekend of learning, training, and networking. With a focus on women's health, self-defence, and personal growth, the event further strengthened the presence and role of women in Taekwon-Do.

## **Veterans Camp – 16th-18th August, Aongatete**

The Veterans Camp remains a highlight of our calendar, providing a welcoming space for our more mature practitioners of all ranks. This popular event fosters camaraderie and offers a unique opportunity for sharing knowledge, refining techniques, and reinforcing the lifelong benefits of Taekwon-Do.

## **National Tournament – 31st August - 1st September, Palmerston North**

Our National Championships saw an impressive turnout, with 316 entries from competitors across the country. The level of competition was excellent, showcasing the dedication and skill of our members. Congratulations to all athletes, officials, and volunteers who made the event a resounding success.

## **Masters Summit – 5th-6th October, Taupo**

The Masters Summit once again brought together our most senior practitioners and instructors for an intensive weekend of advanced training, discussion, and development. This summit is an essential event for maintaining the high standards of Taekwon-Do in New Zealand and maintaining the bonds that make our organisation so strong.

## **ITF World Cup - 25th October - 3rd November, Mar del Plata, Argentina,**

The ITF World Cup in Mar del Plata, Argentina, saw 34 ITFNZ members competing on the international stage. With 1,729 competitors representing 143 clubs from 42 countries, the event showcased an incredible level of skill and sportsmanship. Our athletes performed with determination and achieved some fantastic results. I extend my appreciation to our competitors, coaches, and support teams for their dedication in making this a memorable and rewarding experience.

## **Instructor Update Courses – November 2024**

Continued education for our instructors remains a priority, and the November Instructor Update Courses provided essential training to ensure our both our technical knowledge and our teaching methods align with the latest developments in Taekwon-Do. These courses are crucial for maintaining the quality of instruction and consistency across all dojangs.



## **JustGo**

2024 marked the initial implementation of JustGo, our new membership and event management system. Migrating to this new platform from our customised database solution has certainly not been without its challenges and compromises, but this must be expected of any substantial change. I appreciate the patience and support of our community in adopting this new system.

## **Key Personnel Retirements**

I would like to acknowledge and express my gratitude to two individuals who retired this year from key roles within ITFNZ after many years of dedicated service.

### **Vivienne Holmes**

Vivienne officially retired from writing the calligraphy on our gup certificates—a role she has performed since 1990. For three and a half decades, she meticulously handwrote each student's name, rank, and promotion date on their certificates. Viv began training at the Khandallah club in 1983 and became a key member. I personally remember her teaching me and other white belts when I started my Taekwon-Do journey in 1987. Her patience and dedication have been unwavering. In addition to this role, Viv served as ITFNZ Treasurer and was the instructor of the Mt. Albert club in the 1990s.

### **Neil Breen**

Neil officially retired as the creator and maintainer of the ITFNZ database system. His involvement in ITFNZ's IT infrastructure dates back to 1990 when he helped set up the original PC and software used to manage our membership. He later developed the custom database that has supported our organisation for decades. Having a bespoke IT system tailored to our unique needs is a luxury most organisations could only dream of, and we have been incredibly fortunate to benefit from Neil's expertise and commitment for so many years.

On behalf of all ITFNZ members, I extend our deepest gratitude to Viv and Neil for their invaluable contributions to International Taekwon-Do. We wish them all the best in their future endeavours.

## **Final thoughts**

As we look ahead to 2025, we remain committed to fostering excellence, inclusivity, and growth within our Taekwon-Do community. I extend my heartfelt thanks to our instructors, members, staff, and volunteers for your dedication and support throughout the past year. # CHAIR AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S REPORT

Reflecting on the 2024 year, there have been some profound changes that will greatly impact the administration of our International Taekwon-Do organisation, as prioritised in the Strategic Plan.

The most significant is the implementation of a new membership system, JustGo, to replace the 'Database' that has served our organisation for so long.

Words cannot do justice to quantify Mr Neil Breen's contribution in developing and maintaining the 'Database' on a voluntary basis for several decades. At its inception, the 'Database' was comparable to early commercial solutions but was significantly tailored over time to meet our needs. Mr Breen's service has been recognised, with a life membership and the Presidents Award.

Mr Breen, ITFNZ thanks you so much for your many years of service and we wish you well in your retirement.

JustGo is a subscription-based software-as-a-service solution. It is very different in 'look and feel' to the previous Database, with greater functionality that will take time for all members to get accustomed to. At the time of writing, we are in the implementation phase of the system. As with any project implementation, there will be some minor technical issues to work through and we thank you for your patience and support.

We would like to acknowledge the many volunteer hours and significant expertise contributed by Simon Lloyd-Evans, Grand Master PMcPhail, Mr Brett Kraiger, Mrs Shirley Pygott and Mr Neil Breen, as well as the team of super users who have helped with testing and support. Without the contribution of these people it is likely the transition to a new membership system will have taken longer and cost substantially more.

The constitutional review was completed during the year, with final ratification at a Special General Meeting on 2 February 2025. ITFNZ has completed re-registration as required by the new Incorporated Societies Act 2022. A 2025 focus is assisting Regions and clubs with their re-registration before the April 2026 deadline.

During the Instructor Update courses, we sought feedback on the current syllabus to inform the 'Next Steps' of the Strategic Plan. With some of the big foundational projects completed or nearing completion, next steps will focus on the member's journey, their experiences, and progression pathways. Thank you to all those 130 members who took part in the workshops, providing a wealth of information and thoughts. This information provides the Technical Panels with a starting point for their work as they think about their work plans and priorities.

There are easy fixes, like simplifying administrative processes, and there are some matters that will require ongoing discussion at the Panel and membership level.

Taekwon-Do is in a competitive market to attract and retain members. An identified strength of the feedback was the Syllabus as "a well-developed disciplined system with clear progression, high technical standards and a rich martial arts philosophy that builds skills, confidence and character".

However the Syllabus was also an identified weakness through "repetition, technical complexity, and rigid structure which can lead to boredom, disengagement, and student dropout, especially for younger students or those with different learning needs".



We need to evolve and innovate. There is a balance to be struck between engagement with new, younger students who are samplers looking for fun and basic skills, and those students who become martial artists over time. The goal is to ensure International Taekwon-Do remains relevant, attractive for new students who will go on to become our future leaders, without impacting the tenets, and the art established by General Choi.

## **Financial**

The financial loss of \$31,000 includes JustGo implementation costs of \$29,000. The Board agreed to fund these implementation costs from reserves as our annual trading position is usually break-even before any abnormal expenditures.

Our business model is simple, built on membership numbers, with each student providing two streams of revenue - registration and grading fees. At 3,000 plus members, the organisation has been able to generate financial surpluses. The slow decline in numbers starting pre-covid has removed surpluses and therefore discretionary spending available for projects and growth initiatives. We stated last year that there would be some tough calls on what can be supported as we prioritise projects that benefit all members.

These are difficult financial times for many people and businesses. We know our members and clubs are finding it tough too.

## **Governance**

At the 2024 AGM, Master Gray Patterson was re-elected President for a further two year term. Master Kane Raukura and Mr Vic Gilpin were the successful Elected Director candidates and Ms Fiona Parrant the Appointed Director.

The Board acknowledges the significant service of outgoing Chair Mr Nick Lourantos. Mr Lourantos was a Board member for six years and Chair for five years. He was also a member of the Audit & Risk Committee. Mr Lourantos led the organisation through some challenging circumstances including the COVID-19 pandemic. As Chair, he gave a lot of his time to the role and organisation.

The Board met seven times during the year, either in-person or online.

The Audit & Risk Committee met six times online during the year. We would like to acknowledge the services of Geoff Davis, one of the inaugural independent members, who retired during the year. Alex Foy and Dr. Andrew Wood were appointed as independent members.

We would like to thank our President, Master Gray Patterson, and Grand Master Davidson as Standards & Discipline Advisor for their work and support during the year.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all instructors, members, staff, and volunteers for your patience, assistance, continued participation and support.

As an organisation we rely on volunteers to run. There are many roles members can take on, from being on the Board, a Technical Panel or the Youth Council, to becoming umpires and running tournaments, to training for international competition, to becoming an instructor and opening a club. Going forward, we need more of our younger cohorts to step forward and take on a leadership role within the organisation. The Board looks forward to working with all of you in the coming year.



# Strategic Pillars



## Our Context

We are a world class martial art with an exemplar syllabus. Our organisation is filled with passionate people who embrace Taekwon-Do as a sport, a family, a way of life.

However, the structure, systems and processes that underpin our organisation and support our instructors and members are inefficient and outdated.

Our singular dojang and instructor-based model does not always support instructor wellbeing and development, or succession planning. Clubs are closing and fewer clubs are opening.

Our membership is now predominantly youth-based and we do not leverage this base in our revenue streams. Our low number of adults and our churn rates overall create significant inefficiencies and organisational risks.

We teach International Taekwon-Do, the sport, martial art, way of life and tool for social development, according to the legacy of General Choi Hong Hi

# Statement of Accounting Policies

## International Taekwon-Do Foundation of New Zealand For the year ended 31 December 2024

### Basis of Preparation

International Taekwon-Do Foundation of New Zealand (the society) has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

### Revenue recognition

Revenue from services rendered is recognised in the Statement of Financial Performance in proportion to the stage of completion of the service at the reporting date. Revenue for services not provided at balance date is recorded as revenue in advance.

Grants are initially recognised as income in the Statement of Financial Performance, unless the grant has a condition for refund. In this case, grants are classified as grants in advance. When the Society has met the conditions of the grant the funds are moved to income. Grants that compensate the Society for expenses incurred are recognised in the Statement of Financial Performance on a systematic basis in the same periods as the expenses are recorded.

### Bank accounts and cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

### Debtors and prepayments

Accounts receivable are stated at estimated realisable value after providing against debts where collection is doubtful. Bad debts are written off during the period in which they are identified.

Prepayments are expenses paid in advance. The expenses are recognised in the Statement of Financial Performance once provided or used.

### Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs of completion and selling expenses.

Cost is based on the first-in first-out principle and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the inventories and bringing them to their existing condition and location.

### Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment is stated at cost, or fair value if donated, less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Plant property and equipment have not been revalued.

Where an item of property, plant or equipment is disposed of, the gain or loss recognised in the statement of financial performance is calculated as the difference between the sale price and the carrying amount of the asset.

### Depreciation

Fixed Assets are depreciated so as to charge their acquisition value over their estimated useful life on a diminishing value or straight line basis. The following rates have been used:

### **Intangible assets**

Intangible assets comprise intellectual property in design of breaking machines. The society has chosen to amortise the value of intangible asset over a 10 year useful life.

### **Investments and term deposits**

The Society holds term deposits for cash funds currently not required of trading. These funds are not included in Bank Accounts and cash due to the maturity date being more than 90 days. The investments are stated at historical cost.

### **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

### **Creditors and liabilities**

Liabilities are recognised when the goods and services to which they relate are received. Liabilities are carried at the amount of cash, which is required to settle those liabilities. Funds received to which conditions are attached are recognised as revenues unless, in the opinion of the Board, the conditions cannot be fulfilled.

### **Income Tax**

In accordance with Section CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007, the Society is exempt from income tax as it is deemed to be an amateur sports promoter.

### **Changes in Accounting Policies**

There have been no changes to accounting policies this year
